The Nursery caters for 52 children in the morning session and 52 children in the afternoon session. Children whose parents are eligible for the Government's 30 hour free childcare scheme may stay for both sessions (morning and afternoon, which may also

include a paid lunch-break period). All places are dependent upon availability.

The Nursery is led by a full-time teacher and an experienced team of teaching assistants to support the learning and development of every child.

TERM DATES

The academic year 2024/25 begins on Thursday, 29th August and ends on Friday 25th July, 2025. Please see your individual letter for your child's start date. A full list of term dates is available on the website.

There will be 5 INSET days throughout the year—this is when the staff will be in school for training. No children will be in school on those days.

A DAY IN NURSERY...

Morning session:

arrival between 08:35-08:45 and collection between 11:30-11:40.

Afternoon session:

arrival between 12:35-12:45 and collection between 15:35-15:45.

Arriving: The entrance to the Nursery is just off the Junior School path for parttime children and at the back of Nursery for our full-time children. This is designed to give you the opportunity to speak with a key member of staff and to ease congestion at these busy times.

During these sessions, your child will take part in exciting play-based activities which will cover all areas of learning. Some of these activities may be led by adults and some by the children's interests. Rhymes, songs and story-time occur daily to excite and inspire the children and to introduce them to key skills such as listening, making initial sounds, predicting and repeating phrases.



Our engaging curriculum focuses on many different topics including seasonal activities, focused celebrations and opportunities for the children to share their own cultures and traditions.



We use Class Dojo as a brilliant way of bringing you into the class-room. This is an app where we share photos, stories and key moments from our day. You can also use Class Dojo to share photos from home if your child has done something you want us to see.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS...

How can I best prepare my child for Nursery?



By helping them to be able to put their own coat on.

By playing simple games at home where they have to take turns and share.

When can I speak to my child's key adult?

At the end of the session is the best time to speak with the Nursery teacher/key adult.

Class Dojo can be used to message the teacher although we have a quiet time set—this is 17:00 until 08:00 the following morning.

When can I come into Nursery?

There are lots of opportunities to join in with us here at Nursery; our Elf Walk and Sing at Christmas is a definite must. There are also two planned meetings during the year where you can come and discuss your child's progress.

The teaching team are always available to talk to if you have a serious concern.

What does my child eat and drink at Nursery?

Milk and fruit. As part of the National Fruit Scheme, all children receive a small piece of fruit each day. A small carton of milk is also offered at this time. Milk is offered free of charge until your child becomes 5 years-old. Water is available and encouraged every day.

If your child stays all day, you will need to send them with a packed lunch. During the lunchtime period, the children are supervised and cared for by a midday supervisor team.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS...





We strongly encourage all of our Nursery children to wear our Fernwood Primary uniform. This consists of:

- red sweatshirt or cardigan with or without the Fernwood motif;
- white short-sleeved polo shirt with or without the Fernwood motif;
- + grey trousers with elastic waistband, grey tracksuit bottoms or a skirt; or
- + A red and white checked dress for summer.

Our nursery children can wear any colour shoes (but no laces please).

What do I do if my child is not well?

We <u>must</u> have a reason for all absences from Nursery.

Though we clearly do not want children to attend when they are ill, please ensure that your child has the minimum possible time off Nursery. Every day counts!

If your child does become ill at nursery, you will be contacted at home, work or via one of your named contacts so please ensure you update us if they change.

What happens if my child is taking medication?

Staff will administer medication for specific illnesses e.g. diabetes and asthma. If necessary, a medical plan will be drawn up with the school nurse to support your child's medical needs.

We only administer prescribed medicines that need to be given at a specific time whilst your child is at Nursery.
