It is fun to learn about everyone's cultures and religions.

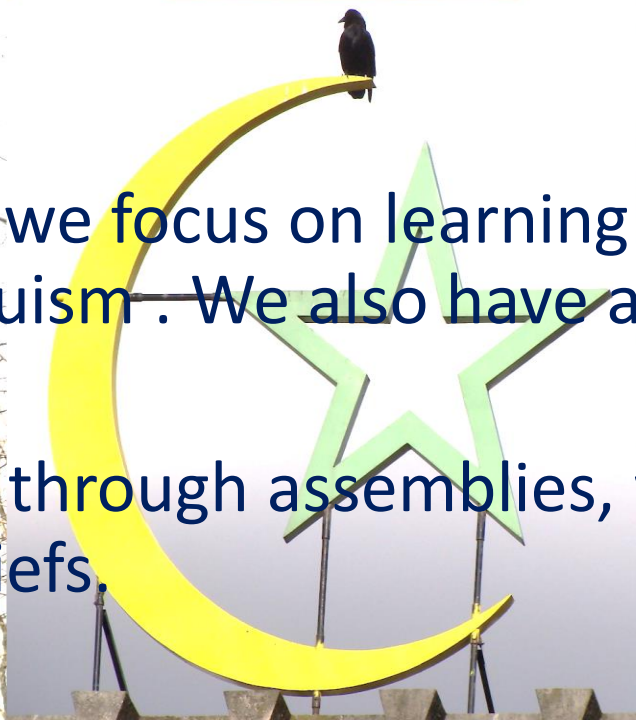
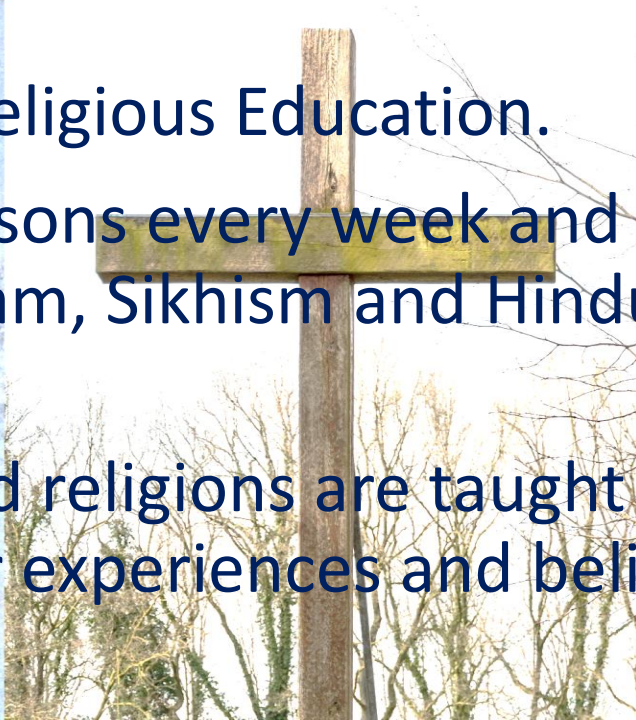
This year's theme is all about peace and last year's was light.

The other world religions are taught through assemblies, where people talk about their experiences and beliefs.

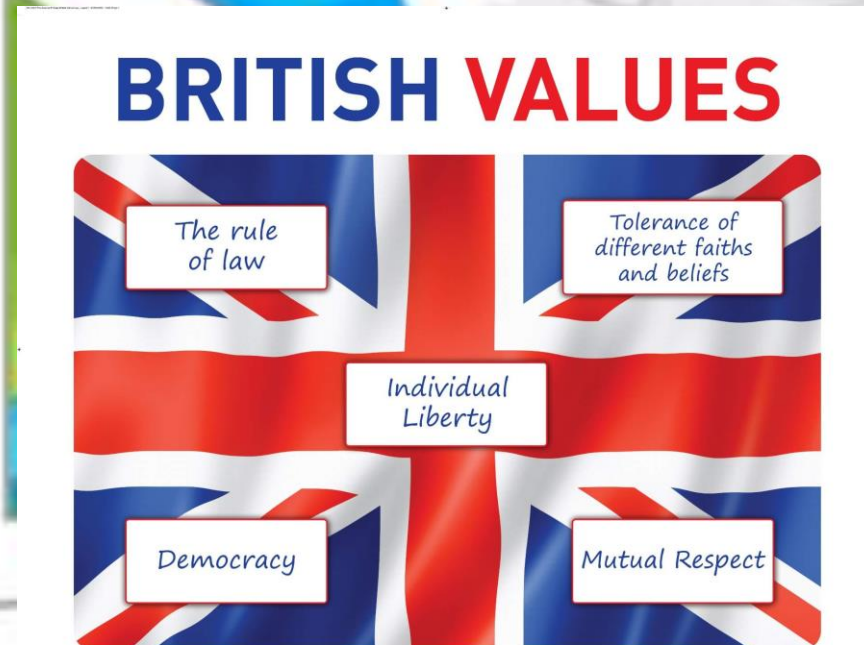
# What is Faith and Culture Day?
